

# Solemnity of All Saints

## *Forming Disciples in Faith*

**A**s we approach Election Day, it's important to remind everyone that the Church is not permitted to endorse any specific candidate but can make recommendations regarding Issues. With that in mind, I'd like to draw your attention to two important issues which face us in Geauga County. The first is Issue 4, a renewal of the levy for Geauga Senior Services. Some of the facts to vote YES for the renewal are compelling, including the fact that the \$10.72 spent per senior per month in the county is used to keep seniors in their homes while the average monthly cost of a senior in a nursing home is \$6,023 per month. Also, Geauga County has had the greatest percentage of increase in seniors over the age of 75 in the state of Ohio over the past year. The second is Issue 5 - a replacement tax levy for Mental Health. Almost all of us know someone who suffers from depression, bipolar disorder, anxiety or another mental illness. One in four family members are affected and one in five teens has some kind of mental health problem in any given year. Many of the programs funded by the State of Ohio over the past year were cut in July 2009 making this replacement levy all the more important. Over 12,000 people each year receive mental health or chemical abuse services in Geauga County. We urge you to vote YES on this issue affecting so many of our brothers and sisters in need of care. Most importantly, make sure that you do VOTE on Election Day, Tuesday, November 3. As a nation, we are given a great privilege to make our voices heard through the opportunity to vote. Be sure to not take it for granted!

On Sunday, October 18, at Gesu Church in University Heights, our Adult Choir had the great privilege of singing for a special Mass commemorating the canonization of St. Jeanne Jugan, foundress of the Little Sisters of the Poor. Jeanne Jugan was born in France and began her ministry by taking a blind woman into her home. Her charity spread to caring for abandoned elderly women and she eventually formed a community of women who went door-to-door requesting food, clothing and money for the women in her care. She worked tirelessly for four decades to carry out the mission of her community. The Cleveland home of the Little Sisters of the Poor has a special connection to Jeanne Jugan. It was founded in 1870 when Jeanne Jugan sent six sisters to Cleveland, Ohio to begin their ministry here. St. Jeanne had a direct connection to the founding of the Cleveland community. The present nursing facility on Richmond Road was built in 1961 and their care for the elderly poor continues. At the Mass, the residents of Sts. Mary and Joseph Home were not only the guests of honor but the first in the liturgical procession honoring the special care and love shown to the elderly and poor. May God continue to bless the good works and efforts in Cleveland and throughout the world begun by this new saint - Jeanne Jugan.

We have received many inquiries about the flu pandemic and our response. There is a plan in place should there be a major outbreak in our parish or the Diocese. At this point the Diocese continues to recommend frequent hand washing and the use of antibacterial solution. We have two stations in place near the sanctuary for the Eucharistic Ministers to utilize before and after distributing communion. We further recommend not drinking from the cup and not extending your hand during the sign of peace if you should feel ill, have a fever or be exposed to others who are ill. We are aware of and are monitoring the situation and will take the proper precautions when necessary.

## *Scripture Reflection*

In a few weeks, we'll be sitting down to a meal and giving thanks for all of our blessings. Some of us may even spend the day at a shelter, preparing dinner for the homeless, and this is a good thing. But we would do well to remember that these shelters are open every day of the year, and just like on a Thursday in November, a meal must be prepared every afternoon. There are those among us who regularly schedule a day or two a week to serve or prepare these meals. They don't do it for recognition or self-fulfillment; they do it because it must be done. They often do such things in total anonymity; they are truly saints of today.

Today's Gospel reading from Matthew is Jesus' gift of the beatitudes. They are gifts because the word beatitude means happiness or blessedness. In detailing those who would receive such a gift, Jesus is revealing who really are saints among us: the poor in spirit, the sad, the meek, the hungry and thirsty, the merciful, the pure of heart, the peacemakers, and the persecuted. Each of these saints desires joy and happiness for all they encounter. In all needs, we find blessedness in Jesus Christ.

We are taught in the Catechism of the Catholic Church that the church is "a communion of saints." This expression is defined first and foremost in the Eucharist, by which the faithful are united in one body. It also refers to all who have suffered in the name of Christ to better our lives (CCC 960-961). Today is the feast of All Saints, in which we recognize and give thanks for those who have gone before us preserving and promoting Christianity, some having paid the ultimate sacrifice for their beliefs. We are called to be saints for today. Will we answer?

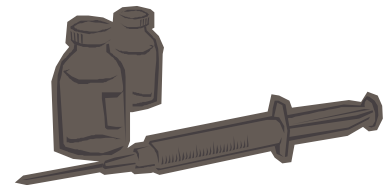
